## **Rob Baggett's Beat**

### **Making Disciples of Our Children**

I believe that we have a great opportunity to make disciples of this wonderful group of children attending our church regularly on Wednesday night and Sunday morning. And I mean disciples, not just church members.

To fulfill our mission as followers of Jesus, we must be diligent in teaching all the basic beliefs and practices of faithful Christians to every child and young person we know. In Deuteronomy 6: 5-9, we read: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, and when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the door frames of your houses and on your gates."

In other words, we keep the focus on God and His way of living, all the time, wherever we are. We no longer tie symbols on our hands, bind God's word on our foreheads or decorate our houses in quite the ways mentioned, but we have other ways of keeping our minds on God these days. In fact, it is much easier for us since we have not only printed Bibles and devotional books freely available, but also the entire Bible and devotional reading right on our phones and other electronic devices.

One advantage Greenlawn has right now is that either our children's parents, grandparents or both are actively involved in bringing them to church and in attending Bible study and worship themselves. In ancient times, the faith was transmitted through the tent, the synagogue and the temple. What we have lost in many cases is the first piece, the tent. In other words, the home is key to ensuring that children are getting the message of Christ and His love because much of the faith is shared casually.

It is at home that children ask questions like "what does it mean that I am a sinner and that Jesus died for my sins?" Parents need to memorize a few key scripture verses and be able to talk about them. Here are a few examples:

Romans 3: 23 - "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Can you explain that we sin when we live as though we don't need God and when we are selfish?

Romans 6: 23 – "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Do you understand that sin separates us from God, the source of life and all good gifts? Can you explain that when we accept Jesus as our Savior and Lord that we receive the gift of eternal life? Many of us think we have to earn salvation through self-improvement before God will accept us. Teach your children that God's love and acceptance is a gift.


Revelations 3: 20 – "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me." This verse refers to Jesus and it means that anyone who will invite Jesus into their hearts will receive him as their Savior and Lord. He will forever after be with them wherever they are and whatever they are going through. He will help them and sustain them in good times and bad, and he will receive them into His Kingdom one day.

Let's commit ourselves to making disciples of our children wherever we are and whatever we are doing. One more verse that some of us have memorized recently may help you: Psalm 16: 8 – "I keep my eyes always on the Lord. With Him at my right hand, I will not be shaken." Amen.


