#### Inauguration Trip Experience by Emauri Singletary

My trip with my school to the presidential inauguration was everything but normal. I had the opportunity to experience America's capital for the first time at its most heated phase. I got to witness cultures and lifestyles which were far more varied than mine, but the most exhilarating moment of it all was being able to see the transferring of an American President.


While In Washington DC I was able to do some sight seeing; visit a few museums, see the home of George Washington, walk through the US memorial where people from military forces are buried, along with photographing some of the most iconic landmarks such as the Lincoln Memorial. Each of these activities brought something to the table but the day of the Inauguration held so much more and couldn't even be compared to touring a museum.

The Friday morning of the Inauguration could be explained as nothing less than a rush. Having to wake up at 3:30 am after previously going to sleep at around 11 the night before wasn't an easy shift at all. By about 5 o'clock the bus was loaded and we were on our way to the parking lot. The area where the bus was able to park didn't put us in a very pleasant position. Walking for 8 miles (roughly 4-5 hours) in the freezing cold with the only food being handouts people gave was beyond exhausting. As if the walking itself wasn't enough, there were lines on top of lines that had to patiently be waited out. Between keeping up with the group, freezing hands, and waiting for hours in lines, I felt as though seeing the Inauguration wasn't worth the trouble. Once we finally were able to get inside of the gate is where the "experience" started to kick in. There was an abundance of protestors with explicit signs, people screaming, this was the part that made it worth it. Although we were inside of the gate there were even more lines with security pretty much everywhere you turned. After waiting a few more hours we were at the peak of our destination. By around 11:30 we were ready to witness the swearing in of the President and VP. It was at this moment I was able to realize for many, this inauguration wasn't seen as exciting but more so emotional. There were protestors which could be heard from miles away along with people booing and crying who felt as though their beliefs and morals were threatened by the swearing in of Donald Trump. Once 12:00 hit and Trump was President the cries of many broke out and the air was covered by thick, white clouds from the lighting of recreational herbs. I took this moment to start snapping photos of what was taking place. We weren't in great viewing range to see the President but through a lens or binoculars it was definitely possible. The Inauguration was over and the trek back to the bus began but wasn't near as treacherous as the opposing walk thanks to the metro. On our way back I could see the smoke of the aggressive riots taking place and was caught in the midst of protestors in which I decided to take photos of. Having not been exposed to these actions by upset people I found this experience exciting and life-changing. The next day our tour guide took us to see D.C. after the sun had set. Seeing the US capital at this time was just as breathtaking as the Inauguration. Protestor signs all along every fence in sight and the surveillance of heavy security was something I never thought I'd see. As we got closer to the White House the protesting got increasingly more and more vulgar. Once the White House was in sight chants upon chants were being recited as fingers were being held high into the sky. I could really see at this moment how much of an impact this one person had on so many people.

This trip to Washington DC was truly an experience and changed the way I view so many things. It's times like these I see how separated America really is and how certain changes affect so many individuals.
